## Carol Meteney: A Navy League Treasure

Our own Carol Meteney was presented with the U.S. Navy Meritorious Public Service Award by Rear Admiral William D. French on February 25, 2006 at the Navy League Northwest Region Conference. RDML French, acting on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy, described Carol as a national treasure and thanked her for her dedication and accomplishments.

Traditionally, the U.S. Navy annually selects one Navy League member from its' 66,000 membership to receive this recognition. Originally, the presentation was to be given at the National Convention in 2005, but Carol was unable to attend, as her husband, Albert, had just lost his battle with pancreatic cancer.

Carol and Al became active in Navy League soon after arriving in this area in the early 1990's. Jean and Jerry Home talk about how Carol's tireless effort and dedication energized the local council. Bill and Cara Tighe remember the warmth and enthusiasm Carol and Al demonstrated in welcoming them and others to the council. Ron Testa, Regional President and past Council President said that "Carol and Al hosted about every military leader in their home at one time or another. A famous event was their chili cook off."

Carol served as President of the Bremerton-Olympic Peninsula Council in 2000 and 2001. She is still the only person in the council's history to have served two terms. She has also served as National Director of the Navy League since 2002 and has served on regional and national committees. Following her presidency of our council, Carol has remained very active on the Board supporting the new officers and members. Carol was awarded the Navy League Northwest Region's top award, the Marilyn Crist Award in 2002 as

the best Navy Leaguer for that year.

Carol is also active in other military groups in our area such as the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA); Bangor Officers Spouses Association (BOSA); Northwest Region Officers Spouses Organization (NROSO); and is past president of the Retired Officers Wives Association (ROWA).

Carol's son Kurt said that he had never seen his mother as happy in her life as when she became involved in Navy League. She is focused and dedicated to the ideals of the organization and, indeed, is a National Treasure. It is no surprise that Carol is seen as Mrs. Navy League and the person to call when questions arise or information is needed.

## A Marine's View of Iraq

Attendees at the March 14, 2006 luncheon were treated with a view of the war in Iraq that few in our country see. Sergeant Craig Shafer, the son of Webmaster Dave Shafer, attended with his wife, Stacy, and provided us a 20 minute look at "ground truth" in Iraq. Sergeant Shafer recently returned from his third tour of duty in Iraq and brought back many pictures and stories.

Sergeant Shafer is attached to the 2nd Battalion, 2nd Marine "Warlords" headquartered at Camp Lejeune. In Iraq, he served as vehicle commander and vehicle gunner for the Commander of the 2/2 Warlords, based at Camp Fallujah, near the palace that was previously occupied by Saddam Hussein's son Uday.

Sergeant Shafer described daily missions in Iraq, and the dangers and challenges, along with the positives. He showed a picture of a group of young Iraqi boys with himself and a fellow marine and stated that this was the future of Iraq and that the marines had a good repore with the local Iraqi people. He described a mission where his unit located a large weapons cache inside of a buried water tank that they found with a metal detector while conducting a sweep for mines. He showed pictures of the effects caused by Improvised Explosive Devices, and the triggers used on them made from simple devices such as a washing machine timer, a battery, 155mm rounds, and propane gas tanks.

Sergeant Shafer's presentation gave us new insight into how the war in Iraq is going. President Larry Salter thanked him for his continued service on behalf of the entire council.
