Lone Sailor Dedication Ceremony

Saturday, May 23, 2 pm on the new Bremerton Breakwater is the date and time for the dedication of the Lone Sailor Statue. Mark the date and be a part of this exciting historical event honoring our military, past, present and future.

Together, we will celebrate this two-year project of bringing this nationally recognized and respected sculpture to our area in honor of the young men and women who

volunteer to serve our country and as a tribute to our rich maritime history.

The success of this project reflects the generosity and pride of our community members. Our thanks go to over four hundred Veterans, business and community individuals and groups who made this dream come true.

The original statue stands on the granite sea at the US Navy Memorial in Washington DC. Since 1987, other Lone Sailor statues have been placed along our coastal waters as symbols of respect and reminders of the great sacrifices made. This Lone Sailor is the only one in the great Pacific Northwest and is joined by one in San Francisco and Long Beach.



An NJROTC Color Guard, music by the Northwest Navy Band, comments by Congressman Norm Dicks, Northwest Navy Regional Commander, Admiral James Symonds and other dignitaries will highlight the afternoon ceremony.

Chairs will be provided on the breakwater, but you might want to be there early as we are expecting a

large crowd. You will also be able to hear the ceremony from the Harbor Boardwalk. Bring your umbrellas if there is a chance of rain.

This will be an event to remember. The Port of Bremerton is also hosting the Harbor Festival this same weekend, so you will be able to see the Kitsap Cup Regatta, Boats Afloat Boat Show, and there will be sailboat races, nautical events, the tall ships and the Virginia V Steamboat in both the Bremerton and Port Orchard's Marinas. Have lots of fun.

Lone Sailor Adds to the Delights of the Harborside District

The Lone Sailor Statue© is part of the rich nautical heritage on the Bremerton Waterfront with a new larger Marina and the Harborside Park, with its beautiful Water Park “geysers,” the Naval Museum and the USS Turner Joy DD 951, a US Naval Museum Ship. Additionally a new Harborside Memorial Plaza park, complete with a Navy ship bow, is under construction above the ferry traffic tunnel. These wonderful historical treasures in our community create a

destination that will draw visitors to our community to witness its rich treasures.

The Lone Sailor Statue© is the 11th such US Navy Memorial site in the Nation. The other sites on the West Coast are in San Francisco and Long Beach, California. Our statue standing on the breakwater overlooking salt water is a very unique setting and will make a lasting and fitting memorial for all to see for years to come.

The Commemorative Wall will be completed in time for the Dedication Ceremony May 23, 2009. Major donors will be honored on the marina breakwater wave wall that will span the distance of the entire statue area and beyond. Included at the site, will be plaques



honoring all of our National Uniformed Services. All donors to the project will be noted in our Dedication Program on the day of the ceremony

This memorial will serve our community by honoring all who serve. The Lone Sailor will greet the many ships transiting Sinclair Inlet. It should provide a special treat for those returning home from deployment. It will also welcome those visitors coming to our community the first time.

Come to visit and see what the Port of Bremerton and the surrounding area have to offer. Plan to visit a walk through history. Wouldn't that be a great way to spend a family afternoon?

Stanley Bleifeld Creator of the Lone Sailor

The Lone Sailor Statue is the creation of Mr. Stanley Bleifeld. He was the winner of a nationwide search to create a blue jacket sailor who would greet people who came to the United States Navy Memorial in Washington DC.

Mr. Bleifeld had served in the Navy during World War II as an illustrator for training manuals. After the war, he had pursued his art career and was selected after a rigorous screening process to work with the US Navy Memorial. Once he was chosen, he was faced with a bigger challenge. The decision makers had a general idea of what they wanted, but had difficulty putting it in words. So a variety of sailors posed for photographs until finally the right one was chosen. Then five different Washington agencies had to approve the rendering before the seven-foot statue could be carved and cast. Getting agreement was not easy.

The Tallix Foundry where the statue was cast is in upstate New York and owned by a former naval officer. Mr. Polich flew the Navy F-9 jet fighters between 1957 and 1959.

In 1987, the US Navy Memorial decided that there had been so many requests for cities to have their own Lone Sailor Statue, that they agreed to sell them, but only if Mr. Bleifeld oversaw the process and the same foundry produced the statue.

The newest statue will be the one in Bremerton and will mark the 11th statue in United States and the only one in the Northwest. This nationally recognized piece of art is a fitting tribute to those who volunteer to keep us safe.
