Naval Undersea Warfare Center, Division Keyport

On October 10, Captain John Dowell, Commanding Officer, Naval Undersea Warfare Center, Division Keyport, addressed the Council. Captain Dowell's career includes 24 years of service on various submarines, including Command of USS Alabama. He now serves in the Acquisition Professional community. He came to Keyport following an assignment at Strategic Systems Programs Office in Washington, DC.

Captain Dowell discussed the history of Keyport, which started as a torpedo station and earned the informal title of "Torpedo Town" during World War II. Keyport provides in-service engineering solutions to a broad spectrum of areas. These include air, surface, and subsurface applications. The torpedo projects at Keyport currently include the Common Broadband Sonar System (next generation sonar) and the MK 54 lightweight torpedo.


The people at NUWC Keyport include 27 military, 1449 civilians, and 517 contractors. Besides engineering services, NUWC Keyport manages and operates the Northwest underwater ranges including one at Nanoose on Vancouver Island.

Captain Dowell gave an overview of the Navy's current status, with currently 281 ships but needing to build up to 313 (about \$13.4B per year of new construction). He discussed the Navy's involvement in the Global War on Terrorism, including Navy sailor's participation on the ground in Iraq, in increasing numbers. He also

discussed the concept of the "1000 ship Navy" using our friends and allies around the world.

Captain Dowell invited council members to take a more complete tour of the NUWC Keyport facilities than the recently completed tour which was time constrained. President Larry Salter concluded the presentation by presenting Captain Dowell with a Navy League mug.


Veterans Day Ceremony, Sat, November 11th Kitsap Pavilion


