Sixty-Nine Years of Dedicated Service

June 23, 2008 marked the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary's sixty-ninth year of dedicated service to the nation. The United States Coast Guard Auxiliary is composed of uniformed, non-military volunteer civilians who assist the Coast Guard in all of its varied missions, except for military and direct law enforcement. These men and women can be found on the nation's waterways, in the air, in classrooms and on the dock, performing Maritime Domain Awareness patrols, safety patrols, vessel safety checks and public education.

The United States Coast Guard Auxiliary was founded in 1939 by an Act of Congress as the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve and redesignated as the Auxiliary in 1941. Its 35,000 members donate millions of hours annually in support of Coast Guard. Over the past year the Auxiliary has provided over three million hours of direct support to the Coast Guard.

Over the past few years the has significantly Auxiliary increased its capacity to support Active Duty Coast Guard units in several mission areas such as Maritime Domain Awareness and the (MDA) America's Waterway Watch program. Auxiliary members are teaching tens of thousands of America's

recreational boaters, and public and private stakeholders who live, work, and play on and around America's waterfront, how to properly identify and report suspicious maritime activity for the benefit of our nation's safety and security. Auxiliary members have been incorporated into the Coast Guard's port, waterways and coastal security missions as well as providing administrative and logistical support at venues ranging from medical clinics to Coast Guard training center classrooms to foreign language services aboard interpreter deployed cutters.

course the Auxiliary conduct continues to traditional recreational safety boating missions. Over the past year they have provided the boating public over fifty thousand (50,000) hours of boating safety education courses and conducted over one-hundred thirtythousand (130,000) vessel safety checks. These education courses and vessel safety checks directly contribute to the prevention of countless search and rescue cases and lives saved each year.

Great White Fleet

How the Japanese thrust in the Western Pacific was controlled at the turn of the 20th century by the US Navy's Great White Fleet, sixteen new white battleships sent on a world-wide tour by President Theodore Roosevelt against the wishes of Congress.

Pearl Harbor

The rise of the Japanese Navy and the road to war beginning in 1854, including hostile Japanese actions, US sanctions, and ending with the attack on Pearl Harbor: US and Japanese equipment, logistics, ships and manpower.

Wednesday, 10/15 6:30-8 p.m., \$20 **Battle of Coral Sea/Dive Bombing**

Information from US code breakers allows Admiral Nimitz to position carriers to stop Japanese in Battle of the Coral Sea. Includes discussion of resources in the Pacific plus the mechanics of dive bombing and torpedo bombing.

Wednesday, 10/22 6:30-8 p.m., \$20

Battle of Midway

How code breaking, dive bombing and decisive carrier action defeated the Japanese at the Battle of Midway, even though US forces were outnumbered. Includes Admiral Nimitz's sinking of four Japanese carriers and the effect this had on Admiral Nagumo.

Wednesday, 10/29 6:30-8 p.m., \$20 Battle of Leyte Gulf

Covers the Battle of Leyte Gulf from the initial invasion to Admiral Halsey's abandonment of the beachhead, to the Battle of Suragaio Strait where a Japanese fleet was destroyed by six old battleships using the classic "crossing the tee" maneuver.
