Navy League Goes to the Track

Attendees at the April 11 Navy League luncheon at Bangor Plaza learned about the Navy Motorsports program and the status of recruiting in the Puget Sound area. President Larry Salter explained that the presentations were tied to the recent decision by the council to support the International Speedway Corporation plan to build a race track in Kitsap County.

CDR Dave Schiffman, Commanding Officer Navy Recruiting District Seattle, talked about the challenges facing Navy recruiters and how Navy League members can help. The "No Child Left Behind" act requires schools allow equal access to school campus' that receive money from the federal government. He described how some schools withhold names of students from recruiters that are provided to other organizations such as corporate recruiters. This practice is justified by parents signing up on a "do not disclose" list.

CDR Schiffman asked Navy League members to support recruiting by engaging the community with good news stories and by engaging youth with sailors. Recruiters in the community need opportunities to gain access to youth and decision makers in their lives such as parents, in order to be able to explain the potential opportunities of military service.

CDR Schiffman then introduced Navy Career Recruiter Senior Chief Jeff Priest, who represents the Navy Motorsports program. He has been assigned as the Navy liaison to the racing team for three years.

He explained that recruiting is all about "finding people" and the Motorsports (NASCAR) program is one tool used for recruiting. He described the NASCAR fans as very patriotic, and that 72 percent of the NASCAR fan base fits the target market for enlistment eligible and influencers (parents and others that influence them to enlist).

Senior Chief Priest explained that the NASCAR program is important to recruiting because of the large audience it receives. It is the number 1 spectator sport in the U.S., and the second largest on television, with 75 million fans. NASCAR runs a 10 month season and reaches 132 countries via television.

The 2005 Motorsports Program teamed with FitzBradshaw Racing (Armando Fitz and Terry Bradshaw). The professional racing team partners with the Navy sponsor and provides the crew and car to participate in the Busch race series. The program ensures a flag officer attends every race where the Navy car races, which included 35 races during the 2005 season. At each race the program provides 30 tickets to sailors, and runs a VIP pit crew program that allows a few sailors to participate in the race as part of the pit crew for the Navy car.

In addition to participating in 35 races, the racing team visits Navy facilities including the Pentagon, Pensacola NAS, Great Lakes, El Centro, and an aircraft carrier, to introduce the racing team to the

Navy. So far the team has not had a tour of a submarine, but they are trying to arrange one.

The value of the Motorsports Program is the advertising return on investment. With a \$6 Million budget, the team has netted over \$20 Million worth of advertising "time."

The 2006 program features Dale Earnhardt Jr. Racing teamed with the Navy Motorsports Program. They will race in 35 races again this year and provide displays at 19 races with their "show car." The Navy program plans to remain with the Busch series of races for the foreseeable future because it costs less than the NASCAR Sprint Cup series.

When questioned, Senior Chief Priest explained that about 25% of the people they contact through the Motorsports Program actually enlist in the Navy. During the presentation Senior Chief Priest showed two videos, one titled "Sailors Make a Difference" and the other a clip that aired on national television with Dale Earnhardt riding the back seat of an FA-18. He was clearly enjoying the ride (straight up several thousand feet immediately after takeoff) and stated "I want to join the Navy."

Larry Salter, our President, closed the presentations by "mugging" CDR Schiffman and Senior Chief Priest. He also thanked Roger Nance, past President, for arranging the presentation.
