### The Artist Behind the Lone Sailor® Statue

The model for the original Lone Sailor<sup>©</sup> statue at the United States Navy Memorial is a young man who was stationed at Bangor, according to Mal Wright, one of our members and current President of the local Submarine League.

The creator of this patriotic bronze statue is the United States Navy Memorial's official sculptor, Stanley Bleifeld. He was elected by a board of recognized art authorities from a field of 36 sculptors in a nationwide search. A native of New York City, he maintains a studio at his home in Weston, Conn., and in Pietrasanta, Italy. He is a veteran of World War 11 where he served as an illustrator for Navy training manuals. He never went into battle, but he helped train those who did.

Before starting to prepare his version of the Lone Sailor<sup>©</sup>, Bleifeld visited fleet and other Navy activities on both coasts, and listened lots of stories. His interviewees represented literally hundreds of years of Navy experience and acquaintance with the Lone Sailor<sup>©</sup>.

"You would want this guy at your battle

station when it's not a drill," former Master Chief Petty Officer, Billy C. Sanders says of the Lone Sailor<sup>©</sup>. "He is the classic American sailor. That statue looks like bronze, but there is plenty of salt, paint, sweat, fuel oil and courage stirred in."

Your Navy League Council wants to help bring a permanent replica of this outstanding statue to Bremerton to help inspire youth and honor veterans for generations to come. The Lone Sailor<sup>©</sup> statue expresses appreciation to the men and women around the world who have put their lives at risk to protect freedom.

# Captain's Corner - Here's to our Sailors by Captain Bradley Johanson, Commanding Officer of the USS John C. Stennis

Hello Dear Friends,

Thank you very much for hosting the luncheon this past month with the focus being on the mission of JOHN C. STEN-

NIS. It was a true pleasure to have the opportunity to explain first hand what we accomplished during our time away from home.

Our nation's greatest asset is our people. People who are devoted to the virtues of honor, courage and commitment. Young people who have chosen to serve their nation and to serve the great American citizens that preserve our national unity and democratic principles. We are so fortunate to have so many talented young Sailors who maintain the tech-

nological edge of our warfare systems at the very highest levels of readiness.

When I reflect periodically about how far our war fighting systems have come over this past three decades it amazes me that our Sailors are able to keep such complex systems operating to perfection. Radars that can detect inbound high speed cruise missiles, global positioning system and laser guided bombs delivered with an accuracy of less than 12 feet, integrated display consoles that simultaneously depict radar, electronic support, missile envelopes, data link symbology and computer graphics depicting the surrounding battle space. We don't use message traffic much anymore, or even e-mail. We coordinate warfare missions real time in classified chat rooms with headquarters operating worldwide. The Navy's information architecture and sophisticated sensor capability has evolved more over the past 30 years than it had during the previous thousand years. There truly is nothing that can compare to the level of precision, speed and lethality

of our latest generation of

weapon systems in the US Navy today, and it is our Sailors that keep it working 24/7 Three Sixty Five.

So how did our Sailors become so good?

The Navy's policies concerning physical fitness, zero tolerance for drug abuse, investment in educational programs, warfare qualifications and training by rate, vice reliance on undesignated seamen has evolved the manpower in the Navy from a force structure manned by manual labor to

a center of excellence manned by subject matter experts to cover every field.

We once were a 600 ship Navy. Now we are close to a 300 ship Navy, a smaller force than we have seen in quite some time. But a force that is tough, lean, battle ready, flexible, joint warfare qualified, high tech savvy and filled with a can-do attitude to successfully accomplish any mission, no matter how tough. Our Sailors are proud of their nation and I thank you for showing your pride in them.

The success of the JOHN C. STEN-NIS is not based upon its 100,000 tons of steel, but upon the 100,000 tons of heart, soul and spirit provided by every Sailor onboard. We are your Sailors, your sons, daughters and countrymen, and we are proud to be Americans.
