## Council Celebrates Coast Guard Month

August is the Coast Guard's birthday, so this month's presentation on August 8th was by LCDR Joshua Reynolds from the

Sector Seattle Prevention Department. Sector Seattle is made up of three elements that were previously separate. They include the Marine Safety Office, Vessel Traffic System, and Coast Guard Group Seattle. Sector Seattle is responsible for waterways from the coast of Washington, through Puget Sound and all the way to the east boundary of Montana. It is the largest sector area in the Coast Guard.

The challenges facing Sector Seattle include the large and growing number of ships transiting, including a large number of oil tankers. Seattle/Tacoma combined is the third largest port (number of ships) in the U.S. The growing cruise ship business also adds to the workload.

The U.S. Vessel Traffic System has a cooperative arrangement with Canadian Vessel Traffic for Puget Sound. LCDR Reynolds described it as working very well. The VTS depends upon an array of radars throughout the Puget Sound region, both US and Canadian, augmented with a relatively new system known as Automatic Identification System (AIS). AIS is required to be on all ships over 300 tons, which includes almost all commercial vessels. It provides ship position as well as identification information.

LCDR Reynolds described the Joint Harbor Operations Center (JHOC) which, when opened this fall, will provide a joint command center for coordination of all agencies that might be involved in an incident at sea in the Puget Sound region.

Prior to closing his presentation LCDR Reynolds invited Navy League members to visit the new JHOC and VTS facilities in Seattle to learn more about them.

As many of you know, our council sponsors the local unit of Sea Cadets, Kitsap Battalion, commanded by NSCC LCDR Charlie Wormwood. Our financial support to the Sea Cadets runs \$3000.00 per year and they provide excellent coverage for our official functions with color guard and escort responsibilities.

The Cadets shared our booth at Kitsap Mall on Military Appreciation Day and a number of individuals stopped by for information. The Cadets involvement resulted in some new recruits and possibly some additional adult leadership help.

This year, the Sea Cadet of the Year, PO2 Mason Athie, was recognized at our Armed Forces Day Gala by presentation of a certificate and the Theodore Roosevelt Youth Medal. The Council also provides limited support to three NJROTC units in the form of recognition to the Cadet of the Year and a summer leadership training scholarship.

The NJROTC units have award ceremonies honoring their Cadets which our Council participates. South Kitsap High School recognized Cadet LCDR Matt King; Bremerton High School recognized Cadet Ensign Joshua Glazier; and Port Angeles High School recognized Cadet CPO Christina Park. As with the Sea Cadet of the Year, each NJROTC Cadet received a certificate from the Council and the Theodore Roosevelt Youth Medal. Each Unit also received a check for \$150.00 for their leadership program.

Our Council also provided the Bremerton High NJROTC Orienteering Club with \$400.00 to support two cadets
