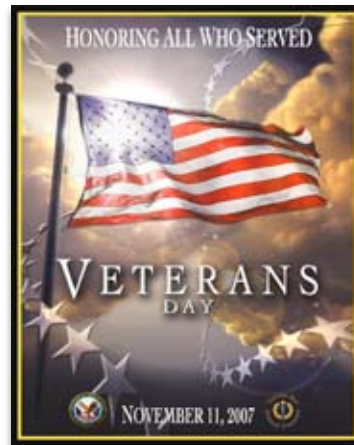

Monday, November 12th - Veterans Day Ceremony

Kitsap Pavilion

A Veterans Day ceremony and display of antique military vehicles/memorabilia will be held on Monday, November 12th, in the Kitsap SUN Pavilion at the Kitsap County Fairgrounds, Bremerton, WA. Over 25 different organizations are working together to plan for this opportunity to "Honor All Who Serve."



The primary sponsors of the event are the Kitsap County Commissioners and the Bremerton-Olympic Peninsula Navy League Council.

Highlights of this year's event are performances by the "Peninsula Pipes & Drums" and the "U.S. Navy Band." The "West Sound Military Vehicle Preservation Club" will have several vehicles for viewing. And, Jurgen Brian and Dale Nitz will have their military memorabilia collections on display.

The Pavilion will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for viewing of the displays. The formal ceremony will start at 10:30 a.m. and end at 11:45 am. Crazy Eric's Drive-In will provide FREE food in the Pavilion immediately after the ceremony as a way of saying 'thanks' to our veterans.

Rear Admiral James Symonds, Commander, Navy Region Northwest, will address the audience and then introduce the guest speaker. Mr.

John Lee, Director of the Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs will serve as the guest speaker. The Knights of Columbus and the Kitsap Battalion Naval Sea Cadets will perform the Color Guard duties. There will be a ceremonial "Ringing of the Bell". "Gold Star" families will be recognized. The

program will conclude with a "Rifle Salute" provided by our local active duty Marine Corps personnel. And, "TAPS" will be performed to conclude the formal ceremony

Motorcycle riding veterans will be out in full force. They usually make up the largest group turnout for this event. They will be departing at 9:45 a.m. from the Legend Harley-Davidson dealership in Silverdale and will ride to the Kitsap County Fairgrounds together to show their support of the troops and our veterans. Immediately after the Veterans Day ceremony, they will all ride back to the Silverdale dealership where a "donations only" Veterans Day BBQ will be provided. All proceeds from the BBQ go to the "Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society."

As many of you know, The Lone Sailor Statue®, the creation of artist Stanley Bleifeld, is the centerpiece of the U.S. Navy Memorial in Washington DC. To purchase a full size replica of that statue from the U.S. Navy Memorial Foundation, and allow for erecting a fitting tribute to honor our military right here in the "other Washington", we need to raise \$300,000.
