BROLPN Council Attends Seafair Week



The 59th annual Seattle Seafair Fleet Week came to a close Aug. 4 in Seattle. Rear Adm. James Symonds, commander Navy Region Northwest stated, "The Navy owes a big debt of gratitude to the Navy League, who coordinates so many of these events."

The Ticonderoga-class guided missile cruiser USS Princeton (CG 59) and Whidbey Island-class amphibious dock landing USS Germantown (LSD 42), both ships home ported in San Diego, made an overnight stop at NAVSTA Everett prior to leaving for the Seattle Seafair festivities. While at Everett the crews of both ships were treated to a great barbecue with live music, exhibits, sports activities which was sponsored by the Everett Navy League Council. The Bremerton-Olympic Peninsula Council assisted Everett with a \$500 finan-

cial contribution. There were other recreational activities sponsored by the NAVSTA Everett. The barbecue hosted over 800 sailors.

The Navy vessels kicked off the week with a parade of ships in downtown Seattle's Elliott Bay and then offered ship tours to the public on Pier 90 during their week-long port visit as part of the Seafair Fleet Week celebration.

Sailors enjoyed discounts at various venues, many different Morale, Welfare and Recreation trips including white water river rafting, a Seattle Mariners baseball game, where two Sailors got to throw out the first pitch, a winery tour and a golf tournament.

September 11 - Never Forget!

Here SHE is! The USS New York, made from the World Trade Center! The USS New York was built with 24 tons of scrap steel from the World Trade Center. It is the fifth in a new class of warship designed



for missions that include special operations against terrorists. It will carry a crew of 360 sailors and 700 combat ready Marines to be delivered ashore by helicopters and assault craft.

Steel from the World Trade Center was melted down in a foundry in Amite, LA, to cast the ship's bow section. When it was poured into the molds on Sept 9, 2003, "Those

big rough steelworkers treated it with total reverence," recalled Navy Capt. Kevin Wensing. Captain Wensing who was there also stated, "It was a spiritual moment for

everybody there." Junior Chavers, foundry operations manager said, "When the trade center steel first arrived, I touched it with my hand and the hair on my neck stood up. It had a big meaning to it for all of us. They knocked us down. They can't keep us down. We're going to be back."

Because of the range of the HH65C the helicopters often respond to missions as far north as Vancouver British Columbia. In addition, the air station frequently responds to calls for assistance in logging and other inland accidents. The Group supports functions for group units. Existing facilities include the hangar, administrative and support facilities, exchange, medical and dental clinic. The docks serve as pier facilities for the cutters Cuttyhunk, Adalie and the 41 foot utility boat. The pier can accommodate vessels up to 400 feet long.

We will again look forward to the next visit to this facility. Happy Birthday USCG! Our next tour will be the USCG VTS facility in Seattle. This unit VTS (Vessel Traffic Service) is an interesting tour. We take the Bremerton ferry to Seattle and walk to the USCG Station. A tour of Madigan Hospital is also planned.
