The Chilean Government not only granted permission to cross through the Straits of Magellan but, in fact, invited the



USS Ronald Reagan to be the first Nimitz Class Carrier to transit the fiord laced waterway which is the second largest salmon "fish farm" region in the world.

The History Channel documented this significant event and fortunately for us we can learn firsthand from our friend Admiral Symonds about his role as the USS Reagan's Commanding Officer negotiating this

intriguing waterway



on March 16th, W. Earle Smith, Jr. received a phone call from the "Mobile Sports Hall of Fame" committee, Mobile, Alabama. Earle was selected from a total of 73 nominees to be inducted into their sports hall of fame 2010. Past inductees include baseball great Hank Aaron and legendary basketball coach Eddie Stanky and football coach Vince Dooley. Earle's own father, W. Earle Smith, Sr. was an inductee back in 1994. So, they will be the first father/son inductees.

Earle started out young as an outstanding athlete. At the state level, Earle was named the "Alabama Junior Golf Champion Runner-up" in 1949. He was named "Mobile's Outstanding Amateur Athlete" in 1951. He earned a total of 14 letters in various sports during his high school years.



He played first string football at the U.S. Naval Academy for three years. He still holds the record for the most touchdowns by a tight-end in an Army-Navy Football Game (2). Naval Academy football was very competitive back then. He played on the team that best Ole Miss in the Sugar Bowl, 21-0 and they beat Notre Dame, 33-7. He has the "game ball" for that Notre Dame game.

The same year he served as Captain of the Naval Academy Football team, he was ranked as their #1 golfer. He has enjoyed a zero handicap twice in his life, once in high school and once at the Naval Academy. He played catcher on the Naval Academy baseball team and was invited to try out with the St. Louis Cardinals.
